Jews have lived in Greece for over 2000 years. Their culture is unique; different from either the Sephardic or the Ashkenazi. My father's father came to the US in 1911, my father's mother and family came a few years earlier. Almost all of the people who stayed in their small ancestral town of Ioannina were wiped out by the Nazi's. There has been a recent interest in preserving the ancient customs as they are in danger of disappearing.

Please join me in celebrating the culture of my ancestors.

November 20th was Trans Day of Remembrance by Michelle Davis, Beth Ami Madrikha

In early November, Beth Ami CCHJ was contacted by Keshet, an organization dedicated to "working for the full inclusion of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Jews in Jewish life." They hoped to spread awareness of Trans Day of Remembrance, which occurs every November 20th. It is a day set aside to remember those killed due to anti-transgender prejudice or hatred. While it was too short of notice to organize an event for our group, I thought it was a day worth learning more about. As a welcoming, open community, the Beth Ami CCHJ community is ideally situated to welcome Jews of all gender identities and backgrounds into our celebrations. While many of the readings and passages refer to a deity, we can easily take the message of tolerance and understanding and apply them to our own Humanistic Jewish lives. Here is a selection from the material that Keshet sent us that I especially liked -

Twilight People

As the sun sinks and the colors of the day turn, we offer a blessing for the twilight, for twilight is neither day nor night, but in-between. We are all twilight people. We can never be fully labeled or defined. We are many identities and loves, many genders and none. We are in between roles, at the intersection of histories, or between place and place. We are crisscrossed paths of memory and destination, streaks of light swirled together. We are neither day nor night. We are both, neither, and all. .. (partial)
